(King County, WA) - 4Culture, King County's cultural services agency, is delighted to announce the launch of the ARTIST REGISTRY VOLUME VI – a comprehensive source of pre-qualified artists prepared to realize both public and private commissions. With over 3,000 images from 91 portfolios by 83 artists, ARTIST REGISTRY VOLUME VI, is one of the only web publications of such magnitude in the industry. Featuring the top public artists in the nation, the Registry selection process was conducted by a panel of peer professionals, seeking work meeting rigorous standards of quality and expertise. The Registry is conceived as a resource for architects, urban planners, developers, designers, engineers and government agencies who are seeking the right collaborator to transform a space into an authentic and fully realized artistic vision. 4Culture Project Manager, Jordan Howland states:

The Registry is a tool for professionals in the field, but is also accessible to members of the general public who are seeking to learn more about public artists and their work. Users can take advantage of a “My Registry” feature to bookmark artist profiles to save for future visits or to share with others.

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ARTIST REGISTRY VOLUME VI OVERVIEW

To reflect the wide range of needs identified by the field, the registry is organized into three categories: PARTS, SITES and PLANS.

PARTS

Established and emerging artists who can enliven the built environment through aesthetic expression. This resource shows projects where artists were commissioned to create unique functional objects such as handmade doors, railings, light fixtures, pavers, grates or grilles.
